Your school has two (2) \$190 scholarships available for this event. Please share this information with rising $7^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade students and select one male and one female from your school. Students pay the \$175 balance of the fee from their own funds or from a sponsor they secure. Scholarships are awarded in the order the applications are received until the capacity of scholarships is reached.
